

MidTown Initiatives 2021

Solidified a partnership with Turn Around Columbus and the G.W. Carver Victory Garden and Farm We hosted a Gardening Supplies and Work Clothing Drive for volunteers and nearby school students to use to assist in and learn about farming. We borrowed heavy equipment, provided volunteers to grade and till garden plots, and loaded and delivered mulch to prepare the ground for planting.

Held the Third Annual Clean MidTown In April, 2021, volunteers collected litter in several MidTown neighborhoods, including Carver Heights, Weracoba-St. Elmo, and Wildwood Circle-Hillcrest.

Partnered with Bicycle Columbus, Columbus Police Department, Jarfly, and the River Valley Regional Commission We rode our 8th annual MidTown Bike Around to showcase the bike-ability of our area with a low intensity ride suitable for all ages, followed with food, fellowship and fun at one of MidTown's favorite watering holes.

Advocated for MidTown businesses MidTown living The MidTown Business promoted member Association businesses through creative videos aired on social media and television, bi-monthly newsletters reaching over 4000 permission based contacts, and posts to social media outlets. We initiated MBA Business Spotlights and MBA Member Testimonials in our social media platforms to promote the businesses and the benefits of MBA membership.

Continued our work to develop a Children's Bicycle Park We finalized a conceptual plan, and continued to explore potential locations, grant funds, project partners and required permits.

Hosted the 10 th Annual MidTown Mingle We celebrated the 10 th anniversary of our beloved MidTown Mingle after skipping a year due to the pandemic. The event was held at Lakebottom Park, where a record-breaking 850 party goers gathered to enjoy a beautiful evening of great food, music, and mingling with friends and neighbors.

Improved and Revamped our Technology We improved our donor management software and redesigned our website for greater donor security, mobile friendly access, and more indepth information about our organization and the MidTown community, including an event calendar which is also shared on social media.

Improved communication with our supporters

We began distributing an additional electronic newsletter, The MidTown Momentum, that includes project updates, upcoming event information and articles featuring MidTown residents or businesses that, in a myriad of different ways, make MidTown EVEN better.

MidTown Partnerships 2021

MidTown, Inc. met the pastor of International Alliance Ministries in March of 2021 to discuss the best and highest use for a parcel the church leased on the corner of Wynnton Road and Forest Avenue. Rev. Lyndon Townsend and his team decided on the location after noticing the dramatic improvements at that intersection, thanks to the Wynnton Streetscape project. They shared their idea to use the space as a thrift shop and café for income to fund the church's ministry programs. We all agreed that the building façade and landscaping needed a great deal of improvement to further enhance that highly visible intersection. MidTown, Inc. subsequently approached Emily Flournoy, an architect with 2WR, who earlier in the year had offered pro bono design assistance in celebration of the firm's 20-year anniversary. Emily's tremendous creativity resulted in a handsome design for the property with low cost, impactful improvements.

The church hosted a festive ribbon cutting on July 17, 2021. Thanks to collaboration and teamwork, we can proudly point to a more vibrant, reactivated corner in the heart of MidTown -King of Kings Korner- that hosts food trucks on the weekends, gathers to watch NFL football on Thursdays, and most recently opened a small food bank to help those in need. The church officially adopted the pocket park and takes meticulous care of the landscaping, regularly picks up litter, and truly treats it as its own. We could not be any prouder of our partnership with Rev. Townsend and his incredible team, who share a common vision for MidTown and our Columbus community. It perfectly illustrates the importance of partnerships to accomplish meaningful improvements when working with our small budget.


