### On the Cover, Sarling Fountain, Lenora Sarling Memorial Park

Carved from Carrara marble in Italy and dedicated in 1929, the Sarling Fountain honors Lenora Myers Sarling, a Columbus civic leader, suffragist, and philanthropist. Commissioned by her family after her untimely death, the sculpture depicts a woman poised as if soaring, shielding her eyes as she looks to the future. For nearly a century, it has stood as a graceful symbol of service, progress, and our community’s enduring spirit. Our partnership with landscaper and Realtor Eric Crabb helped our neighborhood restore “Mrs. Columbus” to her rightful glory.

## Community & Economic Development

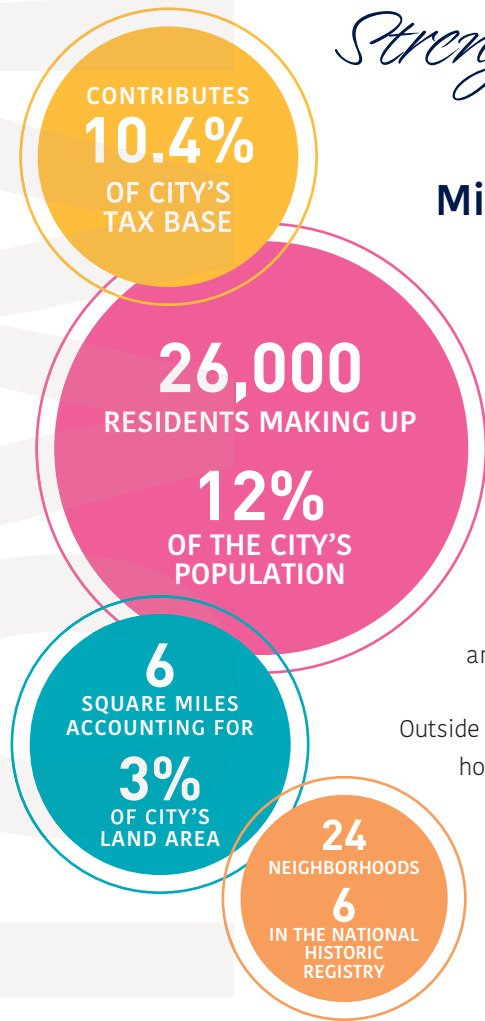

In 2024, MidTown, Inc. advanced a range of initiatives designed to strengthen both economic vitality and community well-being. Revitalized storefronts brought new energy to familiar

corridors. Gateway signage and beautification projects reinforced neighborhood vibe and pride. Infrastructure improvements created safer, more welcoming routes for pedestrians and cyclists. And with planning underway for the region’s first modular pump-track bike park, MidTown reaffirmed its commitment to innovation in active transportation and recreation. After all, health is important, here in the heart of it all.

At MidTown, Inc., economic development is more than charts and figures; it’s about the people who live, work, and play in this incredible place we call home. Each project is a step toward a stronger, more connected, and more resilient community, where residents and businesses alike can thrive and where our shared investment in each other will continue to grow for generations to come.

# Strength IN NUMBERS



## MidTown Neighborhood Alliance

Launched in 2023, the MidTown Neighborhood Alliance (MNA) brings together representatives from all 24 neighborhoods to build connections, share resources, and collaborate on community challenges.

In 2024, the MNA hosted quarterly meetings with city leaders—including the Chief of Police, Director of Parks and Recreation, and 311 and Code Enforcement staff—to discuss key topics like crime prevention, waste management, and city services. These sessions help ensure that neighborhood voices are heard and representatives are equipped to serve their communities effectively.

Outside the meeting room, the MNA supported grassroots efforts such as neighborhood watch groups, Beautify MidTown grants, new signage and gateway improvements, mini-grants for events and enhancing neighborhoods.

When neighbors work together towards a common goal, we don't just improve our neighborhood, we raise each other up and push each other to be the best versions of ourselves.



## MidTown Neighborhood Alliance

**Neighborhood Watch Groups:** In 2024, the MidTown Neighborhood Alliance hosted quarterly meetings featuring city leaders such as police chief Stoney Mathis, Parks & Recreation director Holli Browder, 311 Services Center director Danielle Frazier and Ryan Pruett with Building Inspections & Code Enforcement, fostering direct dialogue on public safety, park improvements, and neighborhood services.

**Beautify MidTown:** This year's projects visibly enhanced shared spaces like the Sarling Fountain, Weracoba's roundabout, sign enhancements at Wynnton Rd. and Hilton Ave., and a greenspace upgrade memorializing Tripp Wade. These beautification efforts bolster neighborhood pride across the district.

**Neighborhood Signage:** MidTown, Inc. made major progress toward design and permitting attractive, cohesive signage across the district. These ongoing efforts will help make our neighborhood more accessible.

**Community Grants:** MidTown awarded grants to support a wide range of community-driven efforts like new signage for Overflo Outreach Ministries, neighborhood block parties, free concerts on the Tiny Stage, a website for the Victory G.W. Carver Garden & Farm, and the festive Witches Ride.

# Partnerships & Initiatives!

## Beautify MidTown

In 2024, beautification remained a core focus, turning parks, intersections, and green spaces into more welcoming neighborhood touchpoints. A highlight was the full restoration of Sarling Fountain, reviving a beloved landmark with structural repairs and refreshed landscaping. New Adopt-a-Spot signage now marks key locations including the fountain, St. Elmo roundabout, and greenspaces along 17th Street, 18th Avenue, and Wildwood Avenue. Other efforts included progress on the Wynnton Gateway, a redesigned pocket park at Wynnton and Forest, and vibrant new banners for Lakebottom Park that showcase neighborhood pride.



## 13th Street Revitalization

Last year, MidTown, Inc. witnessed the completion of the much awaited 13th street lane configuration. This project helped to calm traffic along this vital east-west corridor in the heart of the district, blending infrastructure upgrades with a more bicycle-pedestrian-friendly “minimum grid” that connects neighborhoods, businesses, and greenspaces. A standout success was the transformation of Muscogee Heights, where refreshed landscaping and streetscape enhancements brought new life to the area. This progress was made possible through the leadership of the late Trey Carmack, a key partner and real estate broker. The project also marked a major milestone for MidTown’s Economic Development Grant Fund.

## Partnerships: The George Washington Carver Victory Community Garden & Farm



The seedlings of our partnership with the George Washington Carver Victory Garden & Farm fully sprouted in 2024 with a \$3,500 grant from Southern States Bank, facilitated by MidTown, Inc. These funds supported the creation of a new website and updated farm signage, tools that helped the farm expand its reach, share its mission, and continue to nourish the soil and soul of our community. The fertile land and green thumbs at the George Washington Carver Victory Garden & Farm are adept at growing produce, but this partnership is also essential in cultivating a healthy and sustainable future for MidTown residents and beyond.

## Peach Little League Mural

Columbus, Georgia loves baseball. So, it made sense to partner with Columbus 2025 and our own Peach Little League to celebrate that love with a new, vibrant mural that brought a splash of color and team spirit to Lakebottom’s ballfields. Local artist Jacob Nardee understood the assignment and knocked the ball out of the park with his art design. The teamwork exhibited in this collaboration proves once again that every time neighbors come together for a common goal, it’s a win-win situation for the neighborhood.



# MidTown Rocks!

Few things bring people together quite like live music, and in 2024, MidTown's sound rocked the neighborhood thanks to our Tiny Stage Concert Series and the annual **MidTown GetDown**.

MidTown, Inc. helped power these events with sound equipment, lighting, and promotion, turning Lakebottom Park into Lakewood Amphitheatre. Music educator and MidTown resident Donna Dooley curated a diverse lineup for the Tiny Stage, featuring acts as diverse as school choirs, chamber quartets, and indie acts.

At this year's GetDown, the MidTown Dad Band got the crowd moving before headliner Maria Gabriella Band brought the Cinco de Mayo vibes to the celebration, and of course artist Ralph Betz rolled in with his iconic Art Van, inviting attendees to add their own flair to the mobile mural throughout the event. Families picnicked, kids played, and neighbors rocked out to the sound and spirit of MidTown.



## The MidTown Dad Band

What began as a few dads jamming during their kids' garage band rehearsals quickly evolved into a MidTown favorite: **The MidTown Dad Band**.

Formed in 2022, the group includes neighborhood talent like Crawford Land, Foy Kirven, Brett Woolbright, John and George Sigman, Nick Garcia, and our very-own Julio Portillo on drums. Maggie Portillo even joins in from time to time with a flute solo. Their playful, high-energy sets span everything from The Grateful Dead to Chappell Roan and have become a staple at MidTown events.

The **The MidTown Dad Band** is a joyous celebration of family, friendship, and the power of live music to bring a community together and get the whole crowd moving, grooving, and singing along.

# MidTown Rolls!

## Keeping the Heart of Columbus Healthy and Moving

Midtown sits at the heart of Columbus, and like any heart, it needs to stay active and healthy. In 2024, MidTown, Inc. continued to promote an active community lifestyle, environmental preservation, and mental and physical health maintenance through biking events and infrastructure investments.

The annual MidTown BikeAround brought riders of all ages together for a scenic, police-escorted loop through our leafy streets, ending with a neighborly toast at Jarfly. The fall's Columbus Witches Ride, a whimsical Halloween-themed bike and golf cart parade, invited participants to don costumes and raise funds for the Bill and Olivia Amos Children's Hospital at Piedmont Columbus Regional Midtown.

Progress also accelerated on the MidTown Children's Bicycle Playground at Dinglewood Park, with the schematic design nearly completed, public feedback gathered, and permitting underway. Once built, it will feature the region's first modular pump-track, a one-of-a-kind space for riders of all ages to play, build skills, and stay active.

# MidTown Thrives!

In 2024, MidTown’s business community continued to grow with the addition of eleven new members to the MidTown Business Association. From fresh produce at Napier’s Midtown Market to stories shared at Columbus Bound Bookshop, each new business adds character and convenience to the district.

Other standouts like Jessica Ezzell Landscape Architect, The Edge Church, and Massage Whisperer reflect a rising ecosystem of local talent and personalized services. These are more than storefronts—they’re neighbors and partners, helping MidTown thrive as a place where great ideas take root and grow.

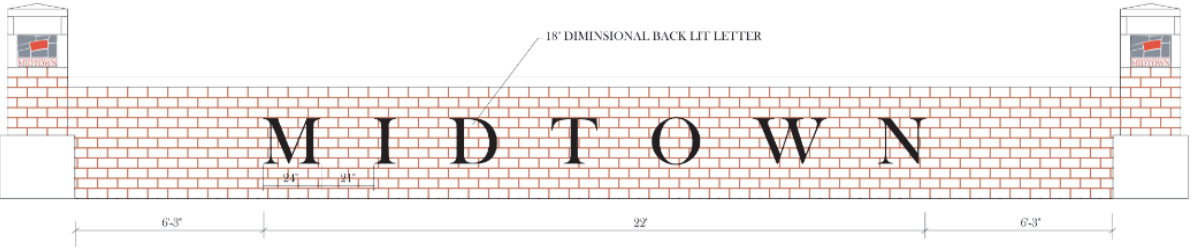

### The MidTown Business Association (MBA)

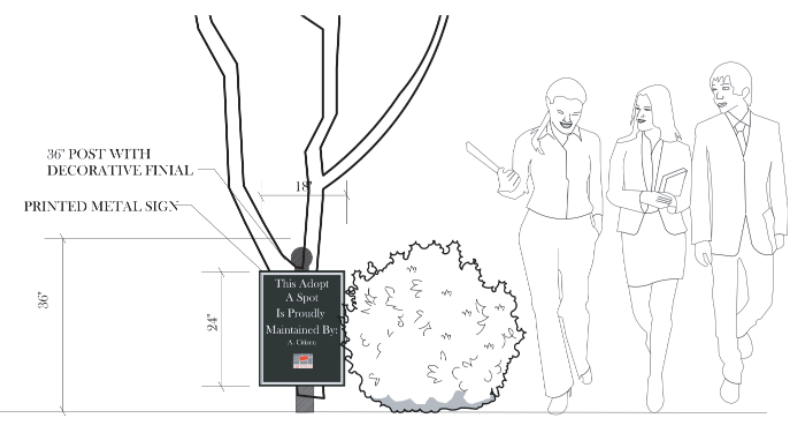
The MidTown Business Association (MBA) is a membership-based program of MidTown, Inc. that supports and promotes local businesses through marketing, networking, and community engagement.
